

On March 13, 2020 we created *A Journal of A Plague Semester* to collect experiences of the pandemic; the project quickly expanded into a curatorial consortium that spanned the globe. Three years later, *A Journal of a Plague Year* contains over 19,000 items and is still growing. That collection addresses significant silences surrounding the pandemic broadly and within JOTPY more narrowly.
