

less than 13% of the U.S. but are
killed by the police at double the

rate as white Americans (Fatal

Force, Washington Post). Many unarmed black Americans have been shot and/or killed by the police this year and the past few years. George Floyd was killed this year; a police officer kneeled on his neck until he died, for allegedly trying to use a counterfeit bill (Chughtai). Breonna Taylor was also killed this year. She was sleeping in her house and was unarmed as she was shot eight times by the police (Chughtai). This past month, Jacob Blake was unarmed and was shot in the back seven times by a police officer (Asmelash). Black people suffering from police brutality has been happening for years in the U.S. It is a product of systemic racism, a major inequality.

Gender inequality is another way that America is not living up to its core value of equality. This includes the gender wage gap and career fields that exclude women. The American Association of the University of Women states that women make 82 cents to every dollar a man makes (AAUW). According to Forbes, women make up only 28% of workers in the science and engineering fields (Francis). These facts prove that women in society are not treated equally. They are rewarded less and receive fewer opportunities to pursue jobs in fields for "men". These two issues in the U.S., police brutality against black people and the gender pay gap, are two reasons why America is not a country that demonstrates equality.

the U.S. after the murder of George Floyd during the quarantine. But even earlier in 2016, Colin Kaepernick knelt during the national anthem to protest against police brutality and many other athletes have done the same since (Eligon). The protests, marches, and kneeling show how Americans are using their right to dissent to fight against systemic racism and police brutality. People are speaking up against what they know is wrong. As for gender inequality, there have been marches, protests, and lawsuits to fight against it. After Donald Trump was inaugurated as president, over a million people marched in rallies across the U.S. They marched because of statements that Trump made that were anti-women and the marches continued for the last 3 years (Keneally). Another form of protesting has happened through lawsuits. Many companies have



been sued for gender pay discrimination.

In 2018, four women filed a lawsuit
against Nike for violating the Equal Pay
Act by paying women less than men who
were doing the same job (Campbell). And
women have filed complaints against
many other big companies for gender pay

discrimination, such as Twitter, Microsoft, Google, and Disney (Campbell). People have been marching and filing lawsuits to fight against gender pay discrimination. By doing this they are living up to the value of dissent and protest. With all the inequalities that happen in the U.S., many Americans have spoken out to fight against them, using their right of dissent.

America has many core values, and it's not living up to a lot of them. It's definitely not a country that currently represents equality, but because of that, it's a country that values dissent
