Dear Blaine School District Families,

Every year we ask families, community members and teachers to refer students to be considered for REACH, Blaine School District's highly capable program. Once a student is referred, additional assessments occur and a Multidisciplinary Selection Committee reviews the student's data and determines eligibility. If students do not meet the eligibility criteria this year, they can be referred again in following years.

If you are interested in having your student considered for REACH, please complete our Parent/Guardian/Community Member Referral Form. Referral forms can be found in the front office of each school and on our website at https://www.blainesd.org under "Menu", "Federal & Special Programs", and then "REACH: Highly Capable Program". Referral forms are due to your child's front office by February 15th for consideration this school year. If you are unsure whether or not your student should be considered, please ask your student's classroom teacher. Teachers are also encouraged to refer students, so they may also be considering your student for REACH.

If you have any questions about the REACH identification process or the REACH program in general, please feel free to contact the REACH Coordinator at your student's school.

This month we will be begin a new character attribute of "Teamwork". Our definition for teamwork is "a group of people working together to meet a common goal." What skills do socially and emotionally competent children and youth have?

Socially and emotionally competent children and youth are skilled in five core areas:

- They are self-aware. They are able to recognize their emotions, describe their interests and values, and accurately assess their strengths. They have a well-grounded sense of self-confidence and hope for the future.
- They are able to regulate their emotions. They are able to manage stress, control impulses, and persevere in overcoming obstacles. They can set and monitor progress toward the achievement of personal and academic goals and express their emotions appropriately in a wide range of situations.
- They are socially aware. They are able to take the perspective of and empathize with others and recognize and appreciate individual and group similarities and differences.
 They are able to seek out and appropriately use family, school, and community resources.
- They have good relationship skills. They can establish and maintain healthy and rewarding relationships based on cooperation. They resist inappropriate social pressure; constructively prevent, manage, and resolve interpersonal conflict; seek and provide help when needed.
- They demonstrate responsible decision-making at school, at home, and in the community. In making decisions, they consider ethical standards, safety concerns, appropriate social norms, respect for others, and the likely consequences of various courses of action. They apply these decision-making skills in academic and social situations and are motivated to contribute to the well-being of their schools and communities.
