Note: You may submit this journal as a written document (handwritten or electronic), an oral history (audio file), or a video history (video file). If you are doing an audio or video file, please also write out a "rough draft" of what you intend to say. This can be bullet points instead of sentences.

Using this template as a guide, reflect on what life was like for you over the course of the pandemic. Think about the things historians want to know: How did you feel? What did you do? What didn't you do? What was it like to be at home so much? How did your relationships change? Did anyone lose their job/start a job? Did your family face economic, social, or psychological hardship?

Did you, or someone you know, get sick? What was that like? Did someone you know die due to Covid? What life events did you miss/change for the pandemic - how did they go, how did you feel? How did you respond to the bigger world events happening around you (election, social justice protests, etc.)? How did you feel about school reopening? Give an honest evaluation of remote school (ex, I don't learn well remotely, but I did like asynchronous Wednesdays). Did you follow all of the regulations, or did your family push back or work around them (be honest- historians want to know).

How has this past year affected your relationships with family and friends? How has this past year affected your relationship with popular culture? Social media? Are you excited to return to movie theaters, or #homemovies4life? What did parents "miss" about this pandemic?

How did this year affect your academic life? What did you learn about yourself (again, be honest)? What did you learn about peers? How might this year affect how you approach school and then college, next year?
