

Biology and culture are two of the key factors in Paul Valent's exploration in *Heart of Violence*, but Valent's childhood experience of surviving the Holocaust inevitably introduces the historical inheritance in the psychology of why people harm each other. Psychiatrist, psychotherapist and traumatologist, Valent explores the nature of violence and discovers an unexpected ingredient, love.

Paul Valent, Holocaust survivor, psychiatrist (ret.), and traumatologist, founded and was long-term president of the Child Survivors of the Holocaust, Melbourne. He also co-founded and is past President of the Australasian Society for Traumatic Stress Studies. Paul has published numerous papers, book chapters, and encyclopaedia entries. In Heart of Violence; Why People Harm Each Other (2019), his fifth book, he finally confronts his persecutors. In asking them Why? he finds a way to think about and understand violence generally.



Rachael Kohn is an author and broadcaster who presented and produced programs on religion, religious history and spirituality for ABC RN from 1992 to 2018. She has also produced award-winning features for television, including The Dead Sea Scrolls (2000). Rachael is the author of two books, *The New Believers: Re-imagining God* (2003) and *Curious Obsessions in the History of Science*


