The Nag Hammadi Library

Our book of the week this week is The Nag Hammadi Library edited by James M. Robinson. The Nag Hammadi library, sometimes known as the Gnostic Gospels, is a collection of early Christian and Gnostic texts unearthed in Egypt in 1945. Perhaps most famous is the Gospel of Thomas which claims to reveal the "secret sayings" of Jesus. The collection also contains a number of poems and riddling utterances from the perspective of a deity. Here's an excerpt from "The Thunder, Perfect Mind":

I am the midwife and she who does not bear.

I am the solace of my labor pains....

*I am the silence that is incomprehensible
and the idea whose remembrance is frequent.
I am the voice whose sound is manifold
and the word whose appearance is multiple.
I am the utterance of my name.*
