Denver artist paints mural in honor of healthcare workers along East Colfax

Austin Zucchini-Fowler said he created the mural as a way to show apprecia for medical workers on the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic.

DENVER — As COVID-19 continues to change life as we know it, one Denver artist decided to take to streets to create a public art tribute to the healthcare workers on the front lines of the pandemic.

Artist Austin Zucchini-Fowler spent a few days over Easter weekend constructing the colorful mural or wall near East Colfax Avenue and Williams Street.

The work of art depicts a masked medical professional donning wings and wearing boxing gloves. The artist said it's a tribute to the healthcare angels who are sacrificing greatly during the pandemic.

"Shout out to all the medical professionals out there! This work is dedicated to all your efforts," Zucchii Fowler wrote on an Instagram post, showing a time-lapse video of the project.



The building's owners, Eric Alstead and Tina Pappas, gave Zucchini-Fowler an opportunity to paint the mural on their building, but it's what the artist chose to paint that holds a special significance to him.

"I have many family and friends [who] are health care workers," he said "I wanted to participate in the c and dedicate a piece to them honoring their hard work and commitment."

Zucchini-Fowler said he spent April 10 and April 11 completing the painting. The finished work of art we revealed on his <u>Instagram page Easter Sunday.</u>
