GEORGE, WATCH YOUR BACK:

The statue tumblers are at it again. Teddy Roosevelt in front of the American Museum of Natural History has got to go. Actually, I can see this one. Sitting astride his horse, he towers over an American Indian on his right and a black man on his left. As one critic says, "clearly a narrative of white racial superiority and domination." It appears, however, the statue is not enough. There are several halls, rotundas within the museum named after Roosevelt, and those are also under attack.

Interestingly, Roosevelt's father was a founding member of the institution. The museum honors President Roosevelt primarily for his role as a pioneering conservationist. He is further criticized for having shown an interest in Eugenics, a popular topic in his era. However, critics would be wise to steer clear of calling him racist.

PANDEMIC UPDATE:

About a month ago I read that Covid-19 (CV), while highly infectious, had one trait that was favorable to its victims – it was said to be a very slow mutating virus. Sorry folks, that's old news. Researchers at Scripps- Jupiter point out that it is the barbs on the virus cells that are responsible for invading healthy cells.
